## BULGARIA AWARDED 2011 BIATHLE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS



UIPM is pleased to announce that the 2011 Biathle World Championships will take place on 25 September 2011 in Sofia, Bulgaria.

UIPM President Dr h.c. Klaus Schormann: *"The Biathle World Championships is the highlight non-Olympic competition on UIPM's calendar. The Biathle consisting of the physical Modern Pentathlon elements of swim & run is a vital tool in developing the grass roots pentathlon skills across the globe.*

*Bulgaria are one of the most experienced organisers after successfully conducting World and European Championships in the past, so this event will surely be one to remember."*

The Biathle World Championships is the climax to the Biathle season which consists of 5 Biathle World Tour events across the globe. Over 300 athletes are expected to converge in Sofia, with the categories ranging from 10 and under to 70 and older, making Biathle truly an event for everyone.

*"Biathle is a fantastic way for smaller Modern Pentathlon countries to participate in an UIPM event"* stated UIPM Secretary General Joël Bouzou:

*"Since the Biathle consists of only running and swimming elements anyone near water (can be a lake, beach, or swimming pool) and land can train and compete. In some cases they don't even need shoes or equipment to embrace the sport. So kids from Congo have the same opportunity to compete against kids from the United Kingdom. Biathle is really an important pillar in the world wide development of Modern Pentathlon" added Mr Bouzou.*

## 2011 NORCECA CHAMPIONSHIPS

### Women's Event



Suzanne Sttetinius, of the USA, beat the local athletes in the last combined Event at the NORCECA Modern Pentathlon Championship, obtaining the gold medal with a final score of 5092 points.

Sttetinius began the Running competition with a 16" handicap behind leader Kathia Martinez, of Mexico. Suzanne Sttetinius finished with a good performance in Shooting and Running, achieving first place.

After a poor performance in Show Jumping, Tamara Vega repositioned herself in the top places. Vega took the silver medal

with 5060 points.

Mayan Oliver gained third after taking first place in the Shooting and Running event, with a total of 5048 points.

"As the competition went by, I felt better with myself and never gave up" said Sttetinius.

Tamara Vega, 9th place winner at the Youth Olympic Games in Singapore 2010 said "my coach and I were looking for the Tetrathlon (Swimming, Shooting, Fencing and Running) that's how it will be at the World Junior Championship in Turkey; this is a good result, but I am not happy with second place".



Vega achieved a gold medal in team's competition with Mayan Oliver and Thelma Martinez. Canada's team took second place and USA had the third position.

### Men's Event



Youth Olympic Games Bronze Medalist Abraham Camacho and Alvaro Sandoval took the first and second places respectively at the NORCECA Open Championship. Eli Bremmer of USA came third.

Camacho and Sandoval lead the Championship; they exceeded experienced competitors such as Eli Bremmer, gold medalist in Rio 2007, and Josh Rikerfox of Canada who won the bronze medal at the same event.

Camacho finished the competition with a strong closing. He achieved 1028 points in Fencing, 1228 in Swimming, 1084 in Equestrian and 2424 points in the Shooting and Running combined event, with a total score of 5764 points.

"It was a very interesting competition, we did a good job in Fencing, Swimming helped us to position ourselves in the top places, I didn't do well in Equestrian, but my performance in the Shooting and Running event made me win" said Camacho.

The silver medal went to Alvaro Sandoval who had 944 points in Fencing, 1252 in Swimming, 1164 in Equestrian and 2300 points in Shooting and Running. Total score of 5660.



Oscar Soto, who had was in second position before the last stage of the competition was beat by Eli Bremmer of USA who had a final score of 5544 points.



Mexico achieved its second gold medal in the NORCECA Open Championship with Abraham Camacho, Alvaro Sandoval and Jonathan Ortega as members of the team; they will seek to participate in the Olympic Games in London 2012. USA took the silver medal in team's competition and Argentina finished in third place.

## 2011 KREMLIN CUP

### Women's Event



Ukrainian Viktoriya Tereshchuk claimed Victory at the first ever Kremlin Cup in Moscow, Russia. Russian Ekaterina Khuraskina was second and Anastasiya Prokopenko (BLR) third. The Kremlin Cup is an invitation only event which offered a massive \$100,000 USD of prize money.



Seizing the lead after the swim, Victoria Tereshchuk didn't give her rivals a chance to get near her, accurately

mastering the show jumping to have a solid lead heading into the Combined Event.

The nearest rival of Tereshuk before the Combined Event was Svetlana Lebedeva (RUS), who started 11 seconds behind. However Tereshuk kept her calm to easily win the event ahead of Khuraskina and Prokopenko, who came from the back of the field to snatch bronze.

Tereshchuk, after claiming gold: *"I am very pleased - to become the best athlete in this tournament. The first emotion - boundless joy that I could beat the strongest Pentathletes in the world."*

### Men's Event



Czech David Svoboda won the men's event at the Kremlin Cup. Svoboda outshot Russia's Aleksander Lesun in the final 2 shoots to claim the \$12,000 on offer for the winner. Hungary's Robert Kasza held on for the bronze medal.

Svoboda started the day strongly finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> in the fencing, equal with Lesun. Youth Olympic Games Champion Ilya Shugarov shocked the field in his first senior international event to win the fencing overall. Svoboda's strong swim and ride meant he started at the same time as World #2 Lesun in the Combined Event and it was not till the 2<sup>nd</sup> shoot where the European Champion showed his class to run away with the title.



Svoboda was ecstatic after the event saying *"I am very honoured to win the first ever Kremlin Cup. This is a great idea from the Russian Federation and I hope there are more similar competitions in the future. I am now looking forward to the World Cup Final in London."*

## WORLD CUP FINAL PREVIEW



The World Cup Final to be held in London, Great Britain on 9-10 July 2011 is about to begin.

Greenwich Park has been transformed from a tranquil place for locals to relax to a world class sporting venue in the space of a few weeks. The picture on the left shows the transformation and the location that not only the World Cup Final Champion will be crowned, but also the Olympic Champions in August 2012.

Spanning around 180 acres, Greenwich Park is the oldest enclosed Royal Park in London. It is located just south of the River Thames in south-east London, a short distance from the Olympic

Park and the Athletes' Village in Stratford. Greenwich Park and the adjacent World Heritage Site are home to many historic buildings, including the Royal Observatory, the Royal Naval College, the National Maritime Museum and the Queen's House.

Crystal Palace, the host of the 2009 World Championships will host the Fencing and Swimming discipline as the swimming and fencing arenas to be used for the Olympic games are not quite ready for competition.

The World Cup Final is the official test event for the London Olympic so attention will be high for the finale of the World Cup Series.

A direct Olympic birth is the cherished prize for the Championships of this event, with this at stake, as well as the generous UIPM prize money, competition will be fierce at Greenwich Park and Crystal Palace.

Only the top 36 men and 36 women from the 2011 World Cup Series have the right to compete in this prestigious event. The final lists can be downloaded from [Pentathlon.org](http://Pentathlon.org).

## 2011 POLISH CHAMPIONSHIPS



On the weekend of 17-19 June 2011 the Modern Pentathlon Senior Polish Championships were held in Drzonkow.

On the first day the ladies competed where Sylvia Gawlikowska-Czwojdzinska of St PP CWKS "Legia" Warszawa and Polish Champion defended her title. Kodedowa Barbora from the Czech Republic took second place, and the third was Boenisz Paulina of St PP CWKS "Legia" Warszawa.

The second day of the championship was the men's event. The winner was Lukasz Klekot ZKS Drzonków, who also defended his title from last year. The second was Golis Remigiusz of UKS G-8 Bielany Warsaw, and the third Kuf Jan from the Czech Republic.

On the last day of the Polish Senior Championships men and women athletes competed in the mixed relay events. In the group of 15 was the best relay CWKS St PP Legia Warsaw 1 in the composition Gawlikowska-Czwojdzinska Sylvia & Michal Kacer. Ahead of their competitors from UKS G-8 Bielany Warsaw in the composition of Skarzynska Aleksandra & Golis Remigiusz and relay ZKS Drzonków 2 in the composition Walesa Magdalena & Staskiewicz Szymon.

## 2011 GERMAN CHAMPIONSHIPS



Bonn – on Saturday, June 4th, Olympic champion Lena Schöneborn from Bonn gained an impressive victory in the women's competition. Being 1st in the world's ranking list at the moment, she could totally convince the audience of her excellent form.

Lena would win the International German Championships with 5644 points, second was Eva Trautmann (Darmstadt) with 5564 points, third place Natalie Dianova from Czech Republic with 5368 points. In the national ranking, Annika Schleu (Berlin) would achieve the bronze medal with 5340 points.

Coming third in the women's competition, she was at the same time the winner of the juniors competition, ahead of Janine Kohlmann (Neuss, 5272 points) and Kate French (5232 points) from Great Britain. Third place at the junior's national ranking went to Anne Hackel (Potsdam, 5120 points).

Lena Schöneborn was happy to also win the Georg-von-Opel-Prize which is worth 2000€ and which was given to her by Carlo von Opel. He also gave the Georg-von-Opel-Prize for the best junior woman, which is worth 1.000 €, to Annika Schleu.

Due to thunderstorms and heavy rain falls the international men's competition could not be carried out until the end. After two disciplines, they had to be cancelled. Some thunderstorms unleashed their force upon the city– the competition could not be continued, as the riding court became totally soaked. Some riders had already finished the course when the jury finally decided to stop the competition, and unfortunately they could not go on with the riding any more. It has not been decided yet when the Men's German Championships will be repeated.

## MODERN PENTATHLON OLYMPIC FENCING HALL OPENED



The London 2012 Handball Arena – the venue at which the world's top modern pentathletes will begin their quest for Olympic gold – has been officially handed over to the London 2012 Organising Committee (LOCOG).

The Handball Arena will host the modern pentathlon fencing - the first element of the pentathlon - at the London 2012 Olympic Games.

Work on the Olympic Park venue was completed in May and more than 160 invited guests gathered there recently to celebrate its handing from the Olympic Delivery Authority (ODA) to LOCOG.

The world's top modern pentathletes will take centre stage at the Handball Arena on the last two days of the Olympic Games – with the men competing on 11 August and the

women on 12 August.

After the fencing, the athletes will move to the Aquatics Centre, also at the Olympic Park, for the swim and then to Greenwich Park for the riding and the run/shoot.

The Handball Arena features a colourful array of seats and a wide range of environment friendly measures.

Dr Klaus Schormann, President of the Union Internationale de Pentathlon Moderne, said: "The venue is very comfortable for us. It is very compact like a soccer stadium, so the crowd is very close to the action, which will create great atmosphere.

"There is a lot of natural light and it is a fantastic idea about the coloured seats."

Jon Austin, Chief Executive of Pentathlon GB, said: "Attending the handover ceremony for the Handball Arena was a firm reminder that the Olympic Games are now just around the corner.

"It's a lovely venue to host what I'm sure will be the start of an exciting 2012 modern pentathlon competition."

The Handball Arena will also host the preliminary rounds and women's quarter-finals of the Olympic handball competition, as well as the goalball at the Paralympic Games.

After the Games it will become a multi-use venue for indoors sports competition and training.

The arena was built with sustainability as a priority – its copper cladding has a high recycled content and the field of play can be naturally lit through 88 rooftop sun pipes, achieving annual energy savings of up to 40 per cent and greater illumination than similar sized conventional lights. During television broadcasting or poor weather, the system can be switched off to allow electrical lighting to be used.

Water usage at the venue is also saved by 40 per cent through a rain harvesting system that feeds into toilets and other non-potable systems.

## PAMPC ELECTIONS

The Pan American Modern Pentathlon Confederation held its Ordinary Assembly on Saturday, June 25 during the NORCECA Modern Pentathlon Championship taking place in the city of Guadalajara, Mexico. Eleven countries were represented at the meeting which was jointly led by PAMPC President Ivar Sisniega,

Status reports were shared during the meeting by the PAMPC president as well as the presidents from the NORCECA and South American confederations, respectively. The calendar of activities spanning from 2011 through 2013 was reviewed and the host cities for upcoming championships were also defined as Buenos Aires in 2012, Santo Domingo in 2013, and Rio de Janeiro in 2014. In addition, regional development strategies

were discussed which included expansion into new countries, organizational strengthening through incentives, follow-up and direct supervision as well as a stronger commitment toward School Biathlon in order to achieve these objectives.

## PENTATHLON FEATURE: THE GREATEST PENTATHLETE EVER



Andras Balczó, the Hungarian modern pentathlete won three gold and two silver Olympic medals in the 1960s and 1970s. Balczó spoke to Dobor Dezsó to reminisce:

Last summer, I returned to the 'Eternal City' of Rome, a half-century after the 1960 Olympic Games. Back then I was a 22-year-old rookie and I had a bad start to my first Games – I had hardly begun the riding when I fell. There was a lot of pain in my right shoulder and I could barely raise my arm to shoot. However, I bounced back and won the swimming competition, and had a legitimate shot at the podium if I could turn in a great running leg.

I remember vividly the rolling hills of the golf course where we ran the 4,000 metres and the deadly heat of that day. Everybody was number crunching; modern pentathlon is in many ways a five-day course in mathematics – or at least in our day it was. I put in a huge effort and finished in a great time, yet just missed a bronze medal by eight points. My fellow Hungarians took

the first two spots and I was part of the trio that became Olympic champions in the team competition. Not making the individual podium toughened me up.

I embarked on a training regime unlike anything anyone else in the world was doing at that time. No one was clocking up miles the way I was. I was determined to run whatever time it took to win an Olympic gold – that's the goal that drove me on. It all followed from my feeling of having failed in Rome.

In Mexico City in 1968, I was 30 and an experienced athlete. I had won the world individual and team titles four times – in 1963, '65, '66 and '67 – but my Swedish rival Björn Ferm held a 65-point lead over me with only the running competition remaining. It was the toughest course of them all: 2,500 metres at altitude with the accompanying shortness of breath and the accumulated pain of four days of competition already burning

our muscles – I'll never forget that path on the Campo Militar; stony, rough and hilly. Ferm held on to win by 11 points, leaving me the individual silver medallist. In the team competition, I became an Olympic champion again but

I still wanted to be the individual gold medallist.

By the time of the 1972 Games in Munich I was 34 years old. I was in fourth position going into the final leg, but I ran into the lead as if I was in a trance and crossed the line in first place. My team-mates threw me into the air and my coach was sobbing. At last I had achieved what I had spent 17 years fighting for.
